Science at Place Farm



The children at Place Farm are working hard during their science lessons.

In Early Years they have carried out an experiment, using bread. All the children touched the bread with dirty hand and then touched another piece with clean hands. They have been observing over time what the bread looks like! They couldn't believe it...




Year one have been looking at the different parts of a plant and learning about different trees. The children have enjoyed walking around the school to see what trees we have and taking a closer look at leaves. They have been finding out the difference between deciduous and evergreen trees.



Year two have been looking at animals. The children have particularly enjoyed looking into life cycles and what animals are vertebrates and what are invertebrates.




Year three have been focusing on the different types of muscles found in their bodies and how a balanced diet is good for the body. They have particularly enjoyed learning about the functions of the muscles and how they work.



Year four have been focusing on the States of Matter, this includes; solids, liquids and gases.



Year five have just started learning about 'animals including humans'. Pupils are learning about the human life cycle. They've enjoyed integrating their iPads into their lessons.



Year six have been continuing their learning on the circulatory system. They have been learning all about the heart and how it works. The children enjoyed drawing diagrams of the heart and labelling these. They have just finished looking at the scientists who influenced what they know about the circulatory system! The children enjoyed researching information either about William Harvey or Aelius Galen.



Rainbow class - Rainbow are learning about The Water Cycle this half term. They have enjoyed making leaflets to show all 4 stages of the cycle and are looking forward to making their own water cycle model.

THE IM FLU VACCINE


We also offer the flu vaccine as an injection, which is gelatinefree. This may also be the vaccine of choice for vegans. Please go to our website where you can find out more about the manufacturing of the flu injection, and then decide if the injection is more suited to your child.

You only need to complete one consent form for each child. If you later change your mind, please call your local team. If your child has this immunisation elsewhere after you have submitted the consent form, you **MUST** inform Vaccination UK rather than the school.
