

PSHE

Spring 1 – Dreams and Goals

PSHE at Place Farm is taught on a weekly basis. There are six puzzle pieces which are split across the year. This terms puzzle piece is all about their Dreams and goals. In this Puzzle, the children will talk about their dreams and goals. It also discusses how they might need money to help them achieve them. They explore different types of jobs that people they know do and that some jobs pay more money than others. They will use this knowledge to reflect on what type of job they might like to do when they are older. The children look at the similarities and differences between themselves (and their dreams and goals) and someone from a different culture.

Contribute to an England-wide research trial into adult numeracy

The trial is a family learning numeracy programme for adults and children (Year 2 or Year 3) to build maths confidence and understanding together.

The programme is designed to introduce concepts, build skills and confidence in maths for parents and carers to support children's maths learning.

This approach is a series of structured, in-person group, learning sessions designed for adults and their children to bolster both numeracy learning and family learning.

The sessions align learning outcomes from KS1 children (Yr2) with Level 1 functional skills.
