PSHE

Spring 1 - Dreams and Goals

PSHE at Place Farm is taught on a weekly basis. There are six puzzle pieces which are split across the year. This terms puzzle piece is all about their Dreams and goals. In this Puzzle, the children will talk about their dreams and goals. It also discusses how they might need money to help them achieve them. They look into the different types of jobs that people they know do, they look at the fact that some jobs pay more money than others and reflect on what types of jobs they might like to do when they are older. The children look at the similarities and differences between themselves (and their dreams and goals) and someone from a different culture.
