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


Outside Contributions and Achievements:



Theme: Celebrating togetherness through art

We are incredibly excited to announce that there will be an art festival held across the trust after half term, during curriculum time. The festival will launch with a live assembly and will then include live art workshops, guided digital exhibition tours and pupil exhibitions and all year groups will be involved in producing some fabulous pieces of art.

The guided digital exhibition tours will consist of the following themes:

- EYFS: Horses
- Year 1: Surprised!
- Year 2: Suffolk Landscapes
 - Year 3: Pointillism
- Year 4: Leanardo Da Vinci
 - Year 5: Renoir
 - Year 6: Rembrandt

These weeks provide wonderful opportunities to the pupils of Place Farm and are heavily subsidised by school funds. Pupils in Early Years, Year 1 and Year 2 (including Rainbow Class) will be watching the "Tap-Dancing Mermaid" on Friday 23rd June 2023:

Gather round for the Moon's magical story about a tippety-top tap dancer who has been watching at night. Marina Skippett creeps out of her house every night to shuffle and stomp on the boardwalk to the sounds of the sea. She can't tap dance at home any more since her evil, tractor-sized aunty banned it! Both coaches mentioned how brilliant the children's attitude were towards the session and they are looking forward to returning next week to teach Year 1 & 2.









EYFS have been exploring penguins and polar bears and the habitat they live in.




<u>Year 1</u>

In Year One the children have been exploring what London is like before they compare it to the city of Nairobi.


Year 2 & Rainbow


In Year Two, they have been exploring the life of the Yanomami people in the Amazon rainforest and what life is like for indigenous people.



<u>Year 3</u>


In Year Three, the children have challenged themselves with their map reading skills, looking into what an OS map is and what it looks like in our area.






<u>Year 4</u>

Dear Parent/Carer

Suffolk County Council is pleased to confirm a further discretionary grant is available to support low-income families over the May half term. 


This week in Year Four, the children have been working hard in all of their learning. Please see below for some photos of their fantastic work
