Year 5 Sustainability Workshop


Sustainability and Power Day

We spoke about how we could conserve energy both at school and at home.







Our children love inviting you in to share stories with them. Thank you to everyone that has joined us so far, and we look forward to seeing more of you each week.








NSPCC Number Day


Throughout the day children will take part in lots of fun curriculum-based activities and work as team to solve Maths based problems.

We would like every child to bring in their favourite book so they can share it in class.






































JOIN THE FAMILY NUMERACY PROGRAMME
