#### Writing during the Spring Term

Year Three just finished their third person stories, all about animals.


Year Four are currently writing adverts to sell an item of their choice.

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

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

# **Phonics Screening Parent Information Session**


The phonics screening check is an informal test that children will need to complete at the end of **Year 1.**During the test, which is designed to test their ability to decode words using their phonics knowledge, children will be required to read a mixture of 40 real and nonsense words.


We would love to share more information with you around the Phonics Screening and ways in which you can support your child in their reading journey.

And then we do it again






#### **Mayor Visit**
