We are 1 of only 11 lead schools across the country - recognised for excellence in our curriculum - with over 600 schools across the world now teaching this curriculum. As a lead school, we share our work regularly and invite other schools in to visit and see our school in action. The children loved seeing our school on the world map!

We had lots of children receiving their coloured certificates today as well as some PROUD certificates.


We also had several children who were celebrated for their achievements from outside of

Attendance

In celebration assembly each week, we also celebrate the classes with the best attendance of the previous week. Attendance is vitally important to a child's success both in school and in later life.

In 3rd place we had 1ED with 97% In 2nd place we had 2LA with 97.1% In 1st place we had 3KM with 97.8%

Whole school attendance was 93.1%



CUSP Lead School

Out of over 750 schools internationally, we are one of only 11 schools to be a CUSP lead school. We were presented with a trophy in honour of this on Monday by Alex Bedford – the CUSP Curriculum Development Director. As a CUSP lead school, other school leaders are invited to visit Place Farm for a day to see the teaching and learning that takes place across the school as a model and example of how high quality CUSP lessons are taught.

<u> Spring 2 - Healthy Me</u>

PSHE at Place Farm is taught on a weekly basis. There are six puzzle pieces which are split across the year. This terms puzzle piece is all about Healthy Me. In this Puzzle, the children will learn about how to be and keep safe and healthy. It also discusses what they might need to do to keep healthy and things they should avoid. In KS1, they look into personal hygiene and how to stay safe on the road (Road Safety). In KS2, they look into the effects that smoking and alcohol can have on the body.
