10-point Attendance Reminders for Parents

- Please call in before 9.30am if your child is not going to be at school. It saves us having to call you!
- If your child is regularly off due to illness, we will call you for a meeting to see how we can help
- Absence due to illness can be unauthorised if we suspect your child is well enough to come to school
- 5. If your child comes into school after **9.05am** the registers are closed and it counts as 1 session of unauthorised absence
- Too many unauthorised absences will result in a fine or a referral to our School Attendance Support Officer at Suffolk County Council
- If your child has a medical appointment please give school a copy of the appointment so we can authorise the absence
- If you know there is an unusual or unexpected reason for your child's absence, please talk to us ahead of time (if possible). We may agree to authorise the absence
- 9. 90% or below is poor attendance (but great in tests)
- If you or your child have any worries about what's happening or has happened in school please bring your child in to school and talk to us about it. Do not give your child a day off

<u>Year 3</u>

We are pleased to share with you some of the fantastic learning that Year 3 pupils have been engaged in this week.

<u>Writing:</u>

We have been busy drafting formal letters to the Prime Minister to express our disappointment at the prospect of the summer holidays being shortened. We are sure that you will agree that they have done a fantastic job at using persuasive language to try and convince Mr Sunak that this should not happen!

Reading:


We continued to learn about the poem 'T'was The Night Before Christmas'. This week we focused on how the poet creates a sense of speed and commotion throughout the poem. We thoroughly enjoyed using instruments, gestures and intonation to emphasise the rhythm, rhyme and events of the poem.

<u>Mathematics:</u>

Pupils have been busy calculating the perimeters of 2-D shapes in mixed units (centimetres and millimetres) and are becoming more confident doing this.


<u>Science:</u>

In Science this week, pupils have learnt what their muscles do and where their 'biceps' and 'triceps' are located.




<u>Geography:</u>

We have been learning what a 'city' and a 'county' is focusing on the counties of Cambridgeshire and Suffolk.



<u>Music:</u>

This week we have been notating rhythms in 2/4, 3/4 and 4/4 time using a combination of crotchets, paired quavers and crotchet rests. Pupils thoroughly enjoyed notating their rhythms on whiteboards and clapping to



see if they had the correct number of beats in each bar.

Design & Technology:

In D&T we have started a new textiles unit where we are experimenting with different solutions to stiffen fabric and create our own special boxes. They will be using skills such as cutting templates, hardening fabrics and using glue to achieve the finished product. We look forward to showing you some photos once these are completed!

Year 5 & 7 Author Visit

Year 5 and 6 had a fantastic time on a Zoom call with Emma Carroll, author of Secrets of a Sun King. Year 6 read this novel last year during their reading lessons and our current Year 5's <u>are</u> reading it now! Emma shared the history within the book and answered questions. 210 other schools also tuned in from across England – it was a really special opportunity!

Dear Parent/Carer

Suffolk County Council is pleased to confirm a further discretionary grant is available to support low-income families over the Christmas holiday. The grant will be ordered by your child(ren)'s school and will be issued as a £30 Edenred supermarket voucher for each eligible child. 
